## EYFS

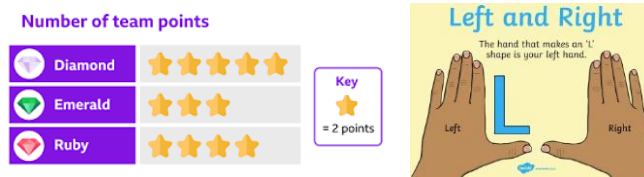
Nursery have had a wonderful week in School! We have been very busy reading the story Each Peach Pear Plum and completing our activities linked to it. We have also done lots of work on the number 3 as part of our Maths sessions. We absolutely loved our Phonics and Dough Disco with our families on Wednesday morning! Everyone joined in with the playdoh and had a great time! Thank you!

Reception have been very busy completing their English, Phonics and Maths activities, particularly with the Naughty Bus who has been on its travels around London visiting lots of different landmarks. We have also loved making our Crane Crowns in preparation for Uganda Day which has involved cutting and sticking skills to make them look their best!

## Key Stage One

In Maths this week the children in Year 1 have been learning all about position and direction. We have been using ordinal numbers and following directions using left and right. We used our Maths learning to help us in this weeks Computing lesson where we were giving directions to a robot!

In Year 2, the children have been learning all about pictograms. We learnt how to read information in a pictogram and created our own class pictogram to represent our classes favourite colours!



## Lower Key Stage 2

We have started our art topic about portraits. Last week we drew our faces and used mirrors to observe the shape of our face and our features. This week, we have learnt how to draw our face in proportion meaning that we can draw our features in the correct place. Some of us were shocked at the difference from last week! We are looking forward to using our portrait to do printing.



## Upper Key Stage 2

In English, we have been studying the text 'Arthur and the Golden Rope'. Arthur shows bravery and determination by facing the challenges of the quest. The children have really enjoyed writing expanded noun phrases and relative clauses to describe his journey.

In Maths, the children have been working hard learning about fractions. The children can confidently find equivalent fractions as well as add fractions by finding the common denominator.
